





子育てに必要な施設が一目でわかる「子育て散策マップ」の外国版について

Kawasaki Ward has prepared foreign language versions of a special map of Kawasaki Ward which was created especially for families with children. This map shows you all the facilities and institutions in the ward that people bringing up children might need.

The title of the English version of this map is "Kawasaki Ward: An Area Guide For Family." And it shows you at a glance all the Health and Welfare Centers, hospitals, nursery schools and other facilities necessary for raising children within Kawasaki Ward.

The map is available in English, Chinese, Spanish, Portuguese and Korean language versions.

The three major districts of Kawasaki Ward (Tajima District, Daishi District, and the central district) are rendered in different colors to make it easier to find the facilities you are looking for.

You can get a copy of the map from the Kawasaki Ward Health and Welfare Center, Tajima Regional Health and Welfare Station, Daishi Regional Health and Welfare Station, and some other places. 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居住支援制度の拡充について

Starting in July the City of Kawasaki expanded the range of people the housing support system is aimed at helping. The system is meant to help people such as the elderly and foreigners who are having problems finding a housing guarantor when they try to rent an apartment. Under the system, qualified applicants are introduced to a guarantor company which has an agreement with the City of Kawasaki, and this helps the people obtain privately-owned rental housing.

If you'd like to learn more about the Housing Support System, there's a pamphlet about it which you can get from ward offices, civic halls, libraries and similar places.

"Legend of Ultraman" Exhibit at the Taro Okamo

The Taro Okamoto Museum of Art in Tama Ward, Kawasaki is now hosting the exhibit "The Legend of Ultraman".

This exhibit will continue until September the 24th. The TV program "Ultraman", which started in 1966, captured the imagination of children all over Japan and set off a boom in monster programs.

This exhibit, focusing on the first "Ultraman", introduces us to the social context of the show, the long road to the show's creation, the making of the hero and the monsters, the storyline of the series, and the ongoing influence of this famous TV program.

Entry to the exhibit is 900 yen for adults, 700 yen for high school and

college students. Middle school students or younger, and people 65 years old or over, can get in for free. The Taro Okamoto Museum of Art is about a 17 - minute walk from Mukogaokayuen Station on the Odakyu Line.
